Proposal #1a

American Education Week

WHEREAS, public schools are the backbone of our democracy, providing young people with the tools they need to maintain our nation’s precious values of freedom, civility and equality; and

WHEREAS, by equipping young Americans with both practical skills and broader intellectual abilities, schools give them hope for, and access to, a productive future; and

WHEREAS, education employees—be they classified or certified—work tirelessly to serve our children and communities with care and professionalism; and

WHEREAS, schools are community linchpins, bringing together adults and children, educators and volunteers, business leaders, and elected officials in a common enterprise;

WHEREAS, the theme of American Education Week is “Great Public Schools: A Basic Right and Our Responsibility”;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, we the Logan-Hocking Local Board of Education, proclaim the week of November 13-19, 2016, as American Education Week in the Logan-Hocking Local School District.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, we encourage all citizens to extend their commitment to public education and to the future of our children by supporting our community’s schools through their time and energy.

Proposal #1b

National School Bus Safety Week

Be it resolved that in honor of National School Bus Safety Week that the Logan-Hocking Local Board of Education commends our Transportation Department for working diligently to ensure the safety of our students as they travel to and from school and school related events.

Resolution Objecting Issuance of Liquor Permits

WHEREAS the Logan-Hocking Local Board of Education objects to the issuance of three (3) NEW liquor permits for the proposed “Chieftain Convenience Store” to be located within 220 feet of Logan High School; and

WHEREAS the Logan-Hocking Local Board of Education feels the operation of a liquor establishment will substantially and adversely affect or interfere with the normal, orderly conduct of the affairs of the school;

THEREFORE be it resolved that the Logan-Hocking Local Board of Education file an objection to the issuance of liquor permits at the site and request a hearing in the county seat.

Accept Scholarship and Miscellaneous Donations

It is recommended that the Logan-Hocking Local Board of Education accept scholarship and miscellaneous donations for the period July through September 2016, as detailed by the Treasurer.

Resolution - Competitive Retail Electric Service

It is recommended that the Logan-Hocking Local Board of Education adopt a resolution authorizing the purchase of competitive retail electric service from the lowest responsible bid submitted to META Solutions (or its alternative) for the billing period commencing with the June 2017 billing cycle and terminating no later than the May 2020 billing cycle.

It is recommended that the Logan-Hocking Local School District renew its contract with Reed & Baur Insurance Agency, Logan and Athens for the following insurance coverages for the period November 1, 2016 – October 31, 2017:

Total cost: \$123,358.00

Insurance is provided through Liberty Mutual Group with an A.M. Best rating of “A”.

The above premiums are computed on updated insurable values and reflect an overall decrease of \$18,346 (12.9%) from last year’s premiums. Liberty Mutual Group offers a wide range of loss prevention services (at no additional cost) which Reed & Baur will continue to work with the District to implement and provide inservices to help reduce claims. Four proposals were received and evaluated.

Employ Parent Transporter

It is recommended that the Logan-Hocking Local Board of Education enter into a contract with Rebecca JayJohn to provide transportation for her child attending Eagle Wings Academy. This contract will be in effect only during the 2016-2017 school year.

F. Executive Session

As permitted by law, such matters may involve:

1. the appointment, employment, dismissal, discipline, promotion, demotion or compensation of an employee, official or student or the investigation of charges or complaints against such individual, unless an employee, official or student requests a public hearing (the Board will not hold an executive session for the discipline of one of its members for conduct related to the performance of his/her official duties or for his/her removal from office);

2. the purchase of property for public purposes or for the sale of property at competitive bidding, if premature disclosure of information would give an unfair advantage to a person whose personal, private interest is adverse to the general public interest;

3. specialized details of security arrangements where disclosure of the matters discussed might reveal information that could be used for the purpose of committing, or avoiding prosecution for, a violation of the law;

4. matters required to be kept confidential by Federal law or State statutes;

5. preparing for, conducting or reviewing negotiations with public employees concerning their compensation or other terms and conditions of their employment; or

6. in-person conferences with an attorney for the Board concerning disputes involving the Board that are the subject of pending or imminent court action or

7. consideration of confidential information related to the marketing plans, specific business strategy, production techniques, trade secrets or personal financial statements of an applicant for economic development assistance, or negotiations with other political subdivisions respecting requests for economic development assistance provided that:

A. the information is directly related to a request for economic development assistance that is to be provided or administered under provisions of State law authorized in Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22(G)(8)(1), or involves public infrastructure improvements or the extension of utility services that are directly related to an economic development project and

B. a unanimous quorum of the Board has determined by a roll call vote the executive session is necessary to protect the interests of the applicant or possible investment or expenditure of public funds to be made in connection with the economic development project.

APPENDIX A

BROADCASTING AND TAPING OF BOARD MEETINGS

Photographic and electronic audio and video broadcasting and recording devices may be used at regular and special Board meetings legally open to the public according to the following guidelines.

1. Photographs, broadcasting and recordings of meetings may be made only when all parties involved have been informed that cameras, broadcasting and/or recording devices are being used. Persons using these devices must notify the Board of their intent to do so.
2. Persons operating cameras, broadcasting and/or recording devices must do so with a minimum of disruption to those present at the meeting. Specifically, the view between Board members and the audience must not be obstructed, interviews must not be conducted during the meeting and no commentary is to be given in a manner that distracts Board members or the audience.
3. The Board has the right to halt any recording that interrupts or disturbs the meeting.

The Board may make the necessary arrangements to have audio recordings of all regular meetings and any special meeting that it deems appropriate.

In order to permit the fair and orderly expression of public comment, the Board provides a period for public participation at regular meetings of the Board and establishes rules to govern such participation in Board meetings.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION AT BOARD MEETINGS

The presiding officer of each Board meeting at which public participation is permitted administers the rules of the Board for its conduct. Where his/her ruling is disputed, it may be overruled by a majority of the Board members present and voting. The presiding officer is guided by the following rules:

1. Public participation is permitted only as indicated on the order of business in the bylaws of the Board.
2. Participants must be recognized by the presiding officer and must preface their comments by an announcement of their name, address and group affiliation if appropriate.
3. Each statement made by a participant is limited to five minutes duration.
4. No participant may speak more than once on the same topic unless all others who wish to speak on that topic have been heard.
5. All statements are directed to the presiding officer; no participant may address or question Board members individually.
6. The presiding officer may:
 - A. interrupt, warn or terminate a participant's statement when the statement is too lengthy, personally directed, abusive, obscene or irrelevant.
 - B. request any individual to leave the meeting when that person does not observe reasonable decorum.
 - C. request the assistance of law enforcement officers in the removal of a disorderly person when that person's conduct interferes with the orderly progress of the meeting.
 - D. call for a recess or an adjournment to another time when the lack of public decorum so interferes with the orderly conduct of the meeting as to warrant such action.
7. The portion(s) of the meeting during which the participation of the public is invited shall be limited to 30 minutes.
