

LOGAN-HOCKING BOARD OF EDUCATION
STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE

GOAL: To select/elect students to become student representatives of the Logan-Hocking Board of Education representing the entire student body as well as the citizens of the school district

To give student representatives a wide range of experiences in leadership development

To teach students how to serve on a board which will include learning parliamentary procedure, problem solving, decision making and conflict management

To teach students life skills

To teach student representatives about issues dealing with public education
Students will learn the importance of serving on a board and the value of being involved in the community.

**Interview to narrow field to no more than 5 students from the current year sophomore class and 5 students from the current junior class

**Students will campaign for their position

**Elected by the student body of LHS

INTERVIEW PROCESS

Interview committee will interview applicants and present no more than 5 applicants from the sophomore class and 5 applicants from the junior class to the student body to be voted on. (If there are no more than 2 applications the committee has the right to not hold an election and appoint the students to the board forgoing an election. Students will conduct their own campaigns. A meet the candidates may be held.

SELECTION:

Two students from the current year sophomore class will be selected/elected for a two year term in May of each year. In 2012 only, one student from the current year junior class will be selected/elected to serve a one year term. If any student cannot fulfill their term, or misses more than two meetings in one calendar year, the Logan-Hocking Board of Education may appoint a student to fulfill the term.

TIME LINE

- February** – contact media, announce the program to staff, students and to public
Prepare letters of invite/applications
Meet with Sophomore and Junior teachers to explain program, distribute application
- March**- applications due
- April** – interview applicants, announce top 5 of each class, campaigns, election
- May** – Student Representatives will take their oath at the May meeting

RESPONSIBILITIES

- **Representatives will attend all board meetings, sitting with the board.
- **Participate in meetings by giving input
- **Representatives will not be permitted to vote or participate in Executive Session
- **They will answer to roll call
- **Their names will be placed on agendas, publications, etc as student representatives
- **Prior to meetings they will receive agendas and meet as a group to review the agenda periodically
- **The will represent the board at functions in the community and at school
